What is a biosimilar?

A biosimilar is the follow-on drug to a formerly patent-protected biologic (= reference medicine).

A biosimilar matches its reference medicine and is therefore interchangeable with it:

- Same active ingredient, same mode of action
- Quality, efficacy and safety confirmed by the Swiss regulatory authority (Swissmedic)
- Interchangeability confirmed by Swissmedic

How long have biosimilars been around?

Biosimilars have been used in Switzerland since 2009. The proportion of biosimilars is rising steadily.



Why choose a biosimilar?


Biosimilars are more cost-effective, equivalent alternatives to the corresponding reference medicine.

- Consistent use of biosimilars in Switzerland could reduce the burden on the healthcare system.
 Around CHF 100 million could have been saved in 2023.
- Biosimilars contribute to the long-term financial viability of the Swiss healthcare system.
